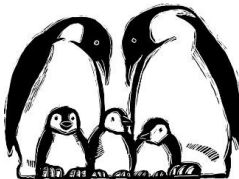

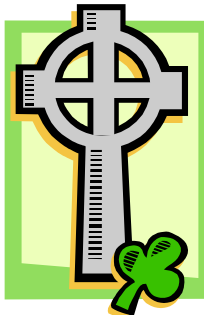

My parents still have a small clay bowl I made for them in 3rd grade. As a work of art, it *might* be able to pass as a Picasso...during his surrealism period...during an earthquake. If you look at it closely, though, there is another very unique characteristic about it—fingerprints. Among the bumps and ridges, my fingerprints are molded into the clay as well.

Some of the most beautiful pieces of pottery in the world carry on them the fingerprints of the craftsmen that painstakingly fashioned them.

Consider this: “*O Lord...we are the clay, and you are the potter. We all are formed by your hand (Isaiah 64:8).*”

God’s fingerprints are all over you!

It’s mind-numbing—the Master of the Universe has left His imprint on each and every one of us. In Psalm 139, David praises the Lord because he is “*fearfully and wonderfully made.*”

Oh, but it takes a lot to get an old lump of clay to the final “wonderful” stage. It is pressed, pinched, and pounded before being put in the fire...twice. It is glazed and painted and polished—enduring many changes. Sometimes, a piece is broken. A true artisan, however, does not throw away the shards. No—he *remakes* the vessel and it turns out *better* and *stronger* than it was before.
